

# Dry Air Flexineb to the rescue

The cold and dry air that Calgary is particularly known for has got us wishing for a human version of our Flexineb!

With winter fast-approaching, we can feel the air getting a bite to it, and combined with our extremely dry year we have found our Flexineb to be a critical asset to our horses' well-being. Using just saline solution through the machine, we can clearly detect an improvement in our horses' breathing, ability to train and overall health.

The nebulizer aerosolizes saline solution (or prescribed medication such as

corticosteroids or bronchodilators as needed) that are inhaled all the way into the lungs by the horse, ensuring the benefits of the solution or medication reach the targeted area. Horses that are breathing in stale air in stables that are filled with shavings and hay dust can most certainly enjoy a reprieve especially before heading to ride.
