Tail Ribbons



There are several reasons that a rider may put a ribbon in their horse's tail, but most commonly it is to indicate to fellow riders that this horse kicks.

There are actually several different colors of tail ribbon, each one holding a different meaning. Red means this horse may kick, green means this horse is green or inexperienced, blue means this is a stallion, white means this horse is for sale.

While there are a couple of ways to put a ribbon into a tail so that it looks nice, here Kaitlyn has made a simple braid on either side of the top of the tail both with ribbon in them. She then joins the two braids together with a single band.



Alternatively, make one braid in the middle of the top of the tail including the ribbon, and then tie it off after a short few crosses.

These will sit neatly in the tail and not stick out or up.
